Commencement of the Great Barrier from the terminal cape of Mount Terror an extinct volcano, and Mount Erebus still in a state of high activity in Lat. $77^{\circ} 31'$, Long. $169^{\circ} 1' East$. January 28th, 1841.



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View of the mountain range of extinct volcanic cones (much resembling the extinct craters of Auvergne, in central France, only glaciated), forming the starboard side of McMurdo Bay, and nearest to the Magnetic Pole, February 17th, 1841.
