

- a Some other early names, which occur in the Hatfield Register, may be added. Baptized: 1639, Octob. vi., Isaac filius Leonardi Prym. 1649, Aug., Ester., the dan. of Leno. Prim. Buried: 1636, Aug. 29. Thomakima Prime. 1637-8, Jan. 31, Isaack Prime. 1646, Nov. 13, Matheus filius Leonardi Prym. The spelling of the name occurs in various places Prime, Prym. - b 10th August, 1606, a Matthew Prime, of Woolley, gent., obtained a license to marry Elizabeth Brocke. (York Registry). Matthew Prym is mentioned, 5th October, 1682, as the "Ryding Surveyor" to the Court of Sewers, Hatfield. There is, I am informed by a connection of the 1amily, a tradition that one of these old De la Prymes, believed to be this Matthew, was once weighted, in the market-place, at Thorne, against another person, for a wager. The result was, it is said, that the De 1a Pryme was only twenty-eight, whilst his opponent was thirty stones! Matthew died in 1634, otherwise, had he lived at a later period, he might have had for his competitor in the scales one Richard Saltonstall, who was appointed to the office of parish-clerk of Thorne, 10th February, 1722, and who has recorded, inside the cover of the register, that, on the 15th August, 1724, he "weiged twenty-four stone, and in the forty-fourth year of his age." Besides being a man of this genuine weight, it would seem that he was a person of importance also; for when, on the 16th August, 1735, one "William Isles, saxton, was buried," a note, by another hand, set against the usual entry in the register, informs us that he had been "49 years sxoon," and that "my Lord Saltonstall was then parish clerk, 26 st. wt." The latter official was buried by January, 1739, and it appears to have taken two men to fill up the vacancy occasioned by his removal, for the register goes on to state that John Moxon and John Bedson succeeded him, 8th February, 1739.

- At the Epworth Manor Court, 18 Oct., 1704, it was presented by the homage that Abraham Prym, gen., who held, according to the custom of the manor, a cottage or tenement with barns, etc., in the parish of Belton, called Goodcopp; a close of land containing 6 acres; a fishery in the river Idle, co.; died so seized, and that Peter Prym is his brother and next heir, and of full age.

 g Called Peter Prime. in marriage license, 20th July; and Peter Prym in the register of Thorne, when married. As Mr. Peter Prym, he was elected surveyor of the Levels, 29th March, 1722, at Doncaster Court of Sewers. In 1639 he was collector of the Duke of Devonshire's rents for the manor of Dauscroft, etc. 5th July, 1710, he occurs as one of the originally appointed trustees of the Hatheid, Thorne, and Wroot school property, left by Henry Travis.

 h In the account of the family of Blaydes, printed in Burke's Commoners, vol. 1, 1836, p. 668, this Francis Wood is described as an esq., and is there stated to be "ancestor of Sir Francis Lindley Wood, Durt.," which does not, however, seem to be confirmed. In Burke's Dictionary of the Landed Gentry, ed. 1868, the latter statement is omitted. The following entries in the Hatfield registers probably relate to him and his family.

- i The name of Johnson is of frequent occurrence in the register of Frodingham, co. Lincoln, in which parish Brumby is situate. I have not met with any descendants of this marriage. In 1703, "Ann, the wife of Thomas Johnson, yeoman, was buried, July 3." (Frod. Reg.) At the Munor Court of Epworth, 20th October, 1630, it was found that John Johnson, of Bromby, had died seized of land held by court-roll, and that William Johnson was his son and next heir, about 15 years of age, who, by Elizabeth Johnson, his mother, prayed to be admitted. 18th September, 1633, at same place, Peter Johnson, of Bromby, occurs.

- 1 Æmilia Greenhaigh was born at Hooton Roberts, the 4th of May, 1703, about half an hour after one in the morning; baptized there the 27th of the same month, by father Bosv. My mother Bosvile and sister Greenhalgh godnothers; and Mr. Robt. Darwent godfather.—Family Bible. Cambridge, 1628, penes Rev. C. B. Norchiffe.
- m Mr. Abraham Prym, of the Levels, was appointed surveyor of the Level of Hatfield Chace,

 n It is stated in **Burke's Commoners, vol. iv., p. 707, that, in compliance with the antipathy which then prevailed to everything French, Francis Pryme dropped the "De la," and had his only son, Christopher, registered by the name of Pryme.

 **o This lady (whose maiden name I have not been able to meet with), was, when Mrs. Thompson, the mother of Commodore Edward Thompson, R.N., well known. in his day, by the appellation of "Rhyming Thompson," who was born, I believe, in 1738. He was a Brother of the Trinity House, at Hull. Besides the works of Andrew Marvell, Capt. Thompson edited those of Oldham and Paul Whitehead. His original productions, amongst which was "Sailors' Letters," etc., published in 1766, were numerous: but many of them were of an objectionable character. His journal is noticed in the *Cumbill Magazine*, May, 1868, pp. 610-640. In it he speaks of his "brother-in-law," and "half brother" (tho 'it does not seem that, strictly speaking, he was either). Christopher Pryme; to the memory of whom, an allusion, in a "rhyming" form of words, is not of the most complimentary order. He mentions, also, a married "sister Wright." He died on board the *Grampus*. of which he was commander, off the coast of Africa, on 17th January, 1780. By his will, which was proved in London in April following, he left £100 to Mary, his "ungrateful wife," in honour preferring doubly, by a bequest of £200 and other things, a certain Marvell, whose each ring he bequeaths.
