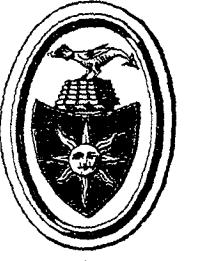
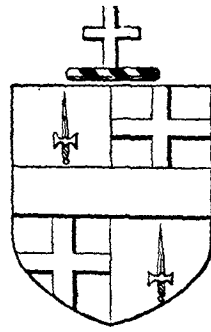

α Some other early names, which occur in the Hatfield Register, may be added. Baptized: 1639, Octob. vi., Isaac filius Leonardii Prym. 1640, Aug. Ester, the dau. of Leo. Prim. Buried: 1636, Aug. 29, Thomakina Prime. 1637-8, Jan. 31, Isaac Prime. 1640, Nov. 13, Mathews filius Leonardii Prym. The spelling of the name occurs in various places Pryme, Prym, Prim, Prymes, etc., and frequently without the "De la." In a list of the settlers on the Levels, given in *Hunter's South Yorkshire*, i., p. 163, is one William Prime.

β 10th August, 1666, a Matthew Pryme, of Woolley, gent., obtained a license to marry Elizabeth Brooke, (York Registry). Matthew Pryme is mentioned, 5th October, 1682, as the "Ryding surveyor" to the Court of Sewers, Hatfield. There is, I am informed by a connection of the family, a tradition that one of these old De la Prymes, believed to be this Matthew, was once weighed in the market-place, at Thorne, against another person, for a wager. The result was, it is said, that the De la Pryme was only twenty-eight, whilst his opponent was thirty stones! Matthew died in 1694, otherwise, had he lived at a later period, he might have had for his competitor in the scales one Richard Saitonstall, who was appointed to the office of parish-clerk of Thorne, 10th February, 1722, and who has recorded, inside the cover of the register, that, on the 13th August, 1724, he "weighed twenty-four stone, and in the forty-fourth year of his age." Besides being a man of this genuine weight, it would seem that he was a person of importance also; for when, on the 16th August, 1728, one "William Isles, sexton, was buried," a note, by another hand, set against the usual entry in the register, informs us that he had been "49 years sexton," and that "my Lord Saitonstall was then parish clerk, 26 st. wt." The latter official was buried 20th January, 1739; and it appears to have taken two men to fill up the vacancy occasioned by his removal, for the register goes on to state that John Moxon and Jolin Bedson succeeded him, 8th February, 1739.

γ This name would be, and was, easily anglicised into Smagge, Smtagg, etc. The Diarist himself has written it Smagge. Peter Smagge, bur. 24 Dec., 1678. Peter Smagge and Ann Amory, married, 2 April, 1678. Da. Thompson and Maria Smagge, married, 13 Aug., 1711, 1707, June 16, Sarah, and, May 25, Mary Smagge, were buried. (Hatfield Register). The name of Smagge occurs in the Thorne Registers also. Prolate of the will of Benjn. Smagge, late of Ditchmarsh, in par. Thorne, co. York (buried at Thorne, 16 November, 1729), granted to Thomas Goodson, 30 Sep., 1727. (York Registry). 13 April, 1692, at the Epworth Manor Court, Benjamin Smagge, and Susanna his wife, surrendered lands within the manor to John Picocke.

δ In the Thorne register occurs the marriage of a David Prim and Mary Beman, on 14th July, 1670.

ε This, no doubt, is the Cognielar of Hunter's list of settlers (*South Yorkshire*, i., p. 169). In the Hatfield Registers occur, Sarah, wife of Jacob Cocheley, buried 30 Oct., 1633. Elizabeth, wife of Jacob Cocheley, bur., 18 June, 1658. John, son of James Cocheley, bur. 27 May, 1685. James Cocheley, bur. 12 Dec., 1702. Elizabeth Cocheley, bur. 5 Aug., 1719. ζ At the Epworth Manor Court, 18 Oct., 1704, it was presented by the homage that Abraham Prym, gen., who held, according to the custom of the manor, a cottage or tenement with barns, etc., in the parish of Belton, called Goodcock, a close of land containing 6 acres; a fishery in the river Idle, etc.; died so seized, and that Peter Prym is his brother and next heir, and of full age.—See Appendix, p. 269.

η Called Peter Prime, in marriage license, 20th July; and Peter Prym in the register of Thorne, when married. As Mr. Peter Prym, he was elected surveyor of the Levels, 29th March, 1722, at Doncaster Court of Sewers. In 1699 he was collector of the Duke of Devonshire's rents for the manor of Dunscoff, etc. 5th July, 1710, he occurs as one of the originally appointed trustees of the Hatfield, Thorne, and Wroth school property, left by Henry Travis.

θ The name of Johnson is of frequent occurrence in the register of Frodingham, co. Lincoln, in which parish Brumby is situate. I have not met with any descendants of this marriage. In 1703, "Ann, the wife of Thomas Johnson, yeoman, was buried, July 3." (Frod. Reg.) At the Manor Court of Epworth, 20th October, 1630, it was found that John Johnson, of Bromby, had died seized of land held by court-roll, and that William Johnson was his son and next heir, about 15 years of age, who, by Elizabeth Johnson, his mother, prayed to be admitted. 18th September, 1630, at same place, Peter Johnson, of Bromby, occurs.

ι Matthew, son of John Cock, gent., was bur. 3 April, 1794, at Hatfield. John, son of John Cock, gent., was bap. 12 July, 1726; died 13, and buried at Hatfield 15 March, 1747-8, aged 22. (See Mon. Inscriptions, Appendix). (Peck, *Dist. Buxary and Thorne*, 1813, p. 104; and Hunter, *South Yorkshire*, i., p. 190, have erroneously printed this name Cooke). 26 April, 1746, guardianship of John Cock, aged 14 years, son of John Cock, late of Salby, co. York, deceased (from the death of Frances Cook, his mother, lately deceased), was granted to Thomas Johnson, of Brumby, co. Linc., gent. (Hugh Blaydes of Kingston-upon-Hull, gent., being surety in bond). Schedule exhibited, dated April 12, 1746, by T. J., curator of John Cock, of Kingston-upon-Hull, states "that by the death of his mother, Frances Cook, an estate, in land and houses, of about 182. a year, then left to him, and this is all."

λ Emelia Grenehalgh was born at Hooton Roberts, the 4th of May, 1703, about half an hour after one in the morning; baptized there the 27th of the same month, by father Bosv. My mother Bosville and sister Grenehalgh godmothers; and Mr. Robt. Darwent godfather.—*Family Bible*, Cambridge, 1629, penes Rev. C. B. Norcliffe.

μ Mr. Abraham Prym, of the Levels, was appointed surveyor of the Level of Hatfield Chace, 18th December, 1724, at a Court of Sewers held at the Crown Inn, Bawtry. Carr-side was probably the house now occupied by Mr. Wm. Moore; over a chimney-piece in which is an old landscape, said to be of the city of Ypres, painted on wood, which may have belonged to the De la Pryme family.

ν It is stated in *Burke's Commoners*, vol. iv., p. 707, that, in compliance with the antiquity which then prevailed to everything French, Francis Pryme dropped the "De la," and had his only son, Christopher, registered by the name of Pryme.

ξ This lady (whose maiden name I have not been able to meet with), was, when Mrs. Thompson, the mother of Commodore Edward Thompson, R.N., well known, in his day, by the appellation of "Rhyming Thompson," who was born, I believe, in 1738. He was a Brother of the Trinity House at Hull. Besides the works of Andrew Marvell, Capt. Thompson edited those of Oldham and Paul Whitehead. His original productions, amongst which was "Sailors' Letters," etc., published in 1706, were numerous; but many of them were of an objectionable character. His journal is noticed in the *Cornhill Magazine*, May, 1868, pp. 610-640. In it he speaks of his "brother-in-law," and "half brother" (who it does not seem that, strictly speaking, he was either). Christopher Pryme; to the memory of whom, an allusion, in a "rhyming" form of words, is not of the most complimentary order. He mentions, also, a married "sister Wright." He died on board the *Grampus*, of which he was commander, off the coast of Africa, on 17th January, 1786. By his will, which was proved in London in April following, he left £100 to Mary, his "nuptial wife," in honor preferring doubly, by a bequest of £200 and other things, a certain Miss Powell, whom he styles his "faithful companion" (probably the "Emma" of the journal). His burial is directed to be at St. Giles-in-the-Fields, near that "glorious, honest citizen, Andrew Marvell," whose seal ring he bequeaths.
